TOM SEES WHAT THEY ARE DOING, AND HE NOTICES THAT, IF THEY CONTINUE, THEY WILL BREAK THEM.

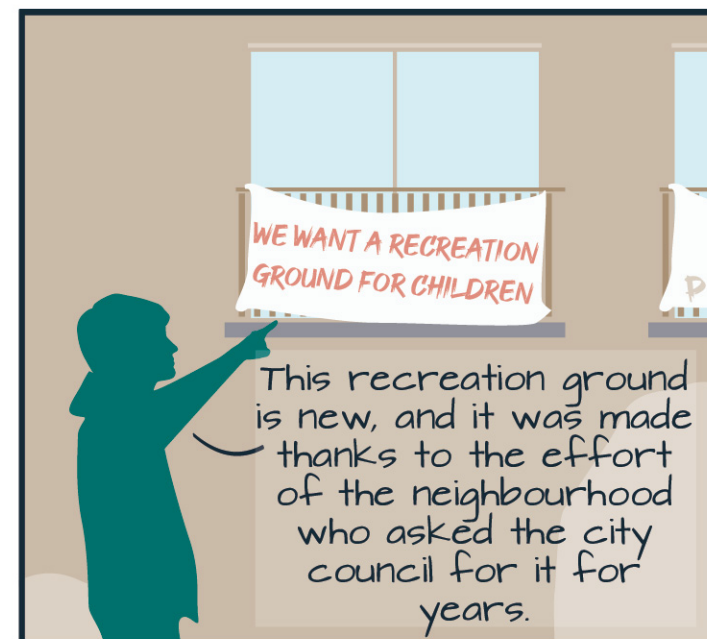
